



## Policies and Procedures - Athletes

### 1.0 Billeting

There are no formal guidelines or rules requiring money to be paid to host families at CKBC sanctioned camps in which billeting occurs. The existing culture of voluntary billeting serves to further the idea that individuals paddle "through the waters to friendship".

### 2.0 Chaperones

For CKBC sanctioned events:

- a) A chaperone is by definition, an adult.
- b) No athlete may be a chaperone.
- c) Chaperones may not sleep in the same room as athletes of either sex.
- d) A given chaperone will be responsible for not more than 12 individuals under the age of 17 on overnight stays.

### 3.0 Athlete Fee Policy

As part of the Integrated Performance System (IPS), CKBC will offer specific Provincial and Regional 'Performance' programming. For athletes to be eligible for any initiative under the Performance Program, they will be required to meet performance criteria set by CKBC and the athlete will be expected to pay coaching fees for the performance program set by CKBC.

Fees will be waived if it can be demonstrated that the athlete is already paying annual coaching fees to a club that is registered with CKBC and in good standing.

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
